Rowing and Sailing – A Meeting of the Chadakoin Club.

Considerable local interest is felt in rowing and sailing this season and the Chadakoin clubhouse at Greenhurst is well patronized. There are two four-oared crews in mild training and some races are promised about the middle of July.

A fleet of seven sailing craft anchored off the clubhouse will soon be improved by a coat of paint. The interior of the house is kept in shipshape condition by the janitor J. A. Rappole and the boats of the club and of individual members were never in better shape for use.

The recent victory of the Cornell varsity crew seems to have given general local satisfaction.

The annual Chautauqua-Chadakoin race it is hoped will be rowed early in August this year. It will probably be contested over the course at Chautauqua as it was rowed on the Chadakoin course last year.

There will be a meeting of the Chadakoin club at the office of Bradshaw Bros., Prendergast building at 8 p. m. Friday, July 2. Proposals for membership must be in the hands of the secretary, D. E. Merrill, not later than 10 a. m. Wednesday to be acted on at this meeting.
